It will link closely with NEPACS visitor centre, the prison and a range of other support agencies to promote family ties during a prison sentence and on resettlement.

**Youth Project Outreach Co-ordinator (Full time - 37.5 hours pw)

NEPACS currently provides weekend facilities at our Durham-based visitors' centres for young people aged 8 – 18. This ground-breaking new post, funded by a grant from the Northern Rock Foundation, will co-ordinate support for young people visiting a relative in prison through activities in the youth rooms, befriending, mentoring, and developing community links.
